# MONTHLY MINDSET: RESPECT (REIGI)

The practice of traditional karatedo is very unique from other sports or activities. One reason for this is that respect is rooted deeply in its practice. Respect in karate is more than being simply nice to one another, or showing good sportsmanship in competition. At the center of karate's element of respect is a practice called reigi. Reigi is a formal system of etiquette that externally one's represents heartfelt thoughts and respect for others. Two key aspects of reigi include the external acts that we use to show our respect, and the internal expression of respect in our hearts. We must be mindful of our physical actions, and what we hold in our heart. The key element surrounding all of the acts of reigi is the realization that we're all interdependent, for all of our great achievements cannot be obtained without those who support us and even those who compete against us. The practice of proper reigi help karate-ka to develop a great sense of humility. These values extend to every aspect of their lives. Attached is a list of many of the external acts of reigi we should exercise.
